MESSAGE FROM THE LIBRARY DIRECTOR

In September 2022 the Board and senior staff of the Library gathered to draft a strategic plan. We put our heads together to create a vision statement - one sentence that communicates who we are. After two days of discussing the Library's past successes and current strengths we came up with this: "We are the welcoming heart of our communities where patrons of all generations are included, educated, informed and inspired."

From their inception, all our branches have blended together two powerful forces: literacy and community. They are places to read where nobody is left out. And not only places to read but also places to be read to, to escape or to engage, to knit with friends or think by yourself, places to warm up in winter and cool off in summer, to learn "free-range" whatever you want and at your own pace.

This past year the Library said goodbye to outgoing Director Raquel Dumas and said hello to me as incoming Director. We also thanked Board Chair Angela Green and Board Member Tracey Berg for their years of service, and welcomed Michael Hepples and Brenda Martinussen as new Board members, with Curtis McClintock taking the role of Chair in November 2022.

I am pleased to say that all our branches have bounced back from the pandemic and are operating at pre-pandemic levels. This is entirely due to our supremely talented and committed staff who make our Regional Library all that it is.

Thanks is also due to our municipal partners, the RM of Rockwood, the RM of Rosser, the Town of Stonewall and the Town of Teulon who not only provide essential funding for the Library but also ensure that the Library Board is staffed with top-notch Trustees. It has been a joy working with the Board in 2022.



2022 HIGHLIGHTS

Opening in-person to Patrons

Our team worked hard to provide safe library services during the pandemic, but we were delighted to return to providing inperson library services in Stonewall and Teulon branches in February 2022. The Bookmobile began welcoming patrons onboard in September 2022, including one curious cat!

Red River Mutual Spruce up your Story Grant

Teulon Library was honoured to win a generous grant from Red River Mutual to make improvements to the library's outdoor programming space and add energy-efficient lights inside. We look forward to the project's completion in 2023.



Summer Reading

The children in our communities were reading superstars this summer! Through our Summer Reading programs, Teulon Library set an institutional all-time-best record with 902 hours of reading logged by their children in the summer of 2022. Stonewall Library nailed it with a whopping 4,270 hours of reading logged by their kids.



MORE 2022 HIGHLIGHTS

Story Walks

Our Stonewall and Teulon libraries set up Story Walk routes in the summer of 2022. Pages of a children's book were set up along an outdoor walking path and participants read as they walked. We estimate that thousands of people enjoyed them over the summer. In Stonewall we included a comment book at the end of the routes. A typical comment: "I enjoyed the stroll and cannot wait for the next routes! Thank you for all you do, SIRL. This town is so fortunate!"



In September 2022 the Stonewall Library launched English Language Conversation Circles to help newcomers to our area practice their English. Thanks to our fabulous volunteers who led the discussions and cared for the children, a number of different newcomer families from Ukraine were able to gather every Saturday morning to practice speaking English, connect with each other and meet new people.

Friends of the Library

The Friends of the Library is a group of volunteers who are committed to advocacy and fundraising for South Interlake Regional Library. We are grateful for the support of the Friends, who raised over \$3,500 for the library in 2022. We were able to purchase a beautiful Library-branded outdoor programming shelter with the funds the Friends raised.




